

Cozy Serger Quilt- **Updated!**

Make this cozy flannel or cotton 35" X 24" quilt quickly and easily on your serger. It is made from fat quarters! Piece it on your $\frac{3}{4}$ thread serger and quilt it with a Cover stitch serger or on your sewing machine. You must know how to thread your own serger and be familiar with your serger.

Sewing Supplies:

1. Serger in good working order. Bring foot controller, electrical cord, all attachments, and manual.
2. 4 cones of regular serger cone thread to work with your choice of fabric.
3. Basic sewing supplies.
4. Fray check, tweezers, and small scissors to cut threads.
5. **Eight** coordinated fat quarters of cotton fabric or **eight** coordinated pieces of 18"x 21" pieces of flannel.
6. One piece of cotton or flannel for backing - 36" X 25".
7. One piece of warm and natural type batting - 36"x 25".

Pre-cut before class:

1. Four strips of 2 ½" X 18" from each of the **eight** coordinated fat quarters for squares.

What I think is easier to finish during class time:

1. *I used two jellyroll bundles for my fabric. Jellyrolls are pre-cut to 2 ½" wide strips by 40" long. I chose 8 different colors and cut four 18" strips of each of the 8 colors.*
2. *That is all I cut for my strips making four blocks used for the top.*
