

Serge A T-Shirt!

Description: Let's serge some clothing! Learn how to take a simple T-shirt pattern and put it together completely on your serger in just a few hours. Sounds too good to be true? Welcome to the world of serging!

You must be familiar with your serger, know how to thread it and where the stitch length and differential feed are located. Your serger must be in good working order before coming to class. This is not a beginner class.

Supplies needed:

1. Any simple T-shirt pattern. Simple means a front, a back and sleeves. You can have facings if you desire. A simple boat neckline is best. This pattern should be for a stretch knit fabric. Please use any good cotton knit fabric or rayon knit fabric.
2. Serger in good working order with all cords and foot controller and manual if you have one. Regular pressure foot on serger.
3. Four spools of Maxi-lock/Todi-lock serger cone thread that works with your fabric.
4. Two NEW needles in your serger, tweezers, screwdriver to replace your needles, just in case, and a small pair of scissors to cut threads. Fray check will also be good.
5. 1/2 yard of fusible knit interfacing pre-cut into ½" wide strips. You can also purchase this pre-cut in rolls.
6. If you have a small iron and an iron pad you can bring that along with a press cloth.
7. Fabric clips or straight pins, but I do prefer fabric clips.
8. Samples of fabric cut on straight grain to test serge.

Have the fabric completely cut out prior to class along with all interfacings the pattern requests be cut also. We do not have time to cut out the pattern in class.

Please have your serger threaded with new needles in it prior to class.
